GOVERNORS STATE PROVIDES OPTIONS

HILLCREST STUDENTS ON A CAMPUS TOUR VISITING PRAIRIE PLACE, THE FIRST ON-CAMPUS RESIDENCE AT GOVERNORS STATE UNIVERSITY WHICH OPENED IN THE FALL OF 2014.

Governors State University (GSU) admitted its first freshman class in August 2014. For the first time in the school's 42-year history, they were finally in a position to serve Illinois as a full, comprehensive, regional university which would give students in the south suburbs an affordable educational option close to home. Freshmen who are seriously considering attending GSU have two pathways to degree completion. They have the option of direct admission to GSU as a freshman or admission to a community college with a plan to complete the associate degree before transferring to GSU or to another university under GSU's existing Dual De-

gree Program. The university serves students of all ages, nontraditional and traditional, working adults and recent high school graduates; it offers programs at all times of the day; and provides strong incentives to community college students to follow a seamless pathway from a community college associate's degree to a GSU bachelor's degree. With the cost of tuition rising, community college is becoming an attactive, affordable option. With the agreements in place to assist with the transition, students are more comfortable in making decisions about their educational future without having to take on large amounts of debt.

On Friday January 27th, the TRiO students at Hillcrest High school took their first out of state college trip with our program. All 37 students arrived close to 6:00 am to a chartered bus and together we made the 3 hour trip to Grand Valley University located in Allendale, Michigan. Grand Valley University is a very affordable option that is cheaper to attend than most in state schools. They are also recognized as one of the top Division II sports programs in the country. They consistently attract talented young people from Illinois because of their academics and athletics.

During the visit we were able to connect with a former Hillcrest student who was part of the panel. The Hillcrest alumna spoke about how she successfully transitioned to college and life in another state. She also addressed the rigor of being a student athlete at the collegiate level. It was a fantastic experience that left a lasting positive impression on our students.

When surveying our students regarding in-state colleges they would like to visit, UIC is always in the top 3. Over the last several years, students from previous Trio programs under the leadership of Jason Thomas, have graduated and gone on to pursue work in the fields of engineering, accounting, graphic design, and psychology. It is a campus that is far enough away from home but just close enough to make trips home on the weekend if necessary. The University of Illinois at Chicago features 15 academic colleges, 83 bachelor's, 93 master's and 64 doctoral degree programs. That means that potential students will have plenty of opportunities

to explore their interests and really find their niche. Located in the heart of one of the world's great cities, the University of Illinois at Chicago is a vital part of the educational, technological and cultural fabric of the region. As Chicago's only public research university with 29,000 students, 15 colleges, a hospital and a health sciences system, UIC provides students with access to excellence and opportunity. During the visit students were able to speak with representatives from 2 of the strongest academic support programs on campus: The CHANCE program and the African American Academic Network. It was time well spent for all who attended.



Tuesday, May 2nd, marked our first annual Senior Day which served as a wrap up session and celebration for all the seniors in the TRiO program. Partnering with 3 Seeds Mentoring for this event was South Suburban College (SSC) of South Holland, IL.

Students were required to finalize all unfinished business that would prevent them from attending college in the 2017 Summer or Fall semesters. Students and parents completed financial aid registration and each student applied to South Suburban College, regardless of any school they may have selected to attend in the fall. In addition to assisting with the online application process, South Suburban shared information about free credit hours and potential scholarships that would cover tuition costs for their first 2 years at SSC.

When financial aid was complete, college acceptance letters were collected and each student submitted their online application to SSC, they were celebrated with pizza, drinks and a Certificate of Completion from 3 Seeds Mentoring Group. They were also recognized at Hillcrest's Senior Awards Night held that evening.

TEACHING STEM USING ADOBE

Global warming is a very serious and real issue. Many people young and old are not really sure of how to explain it and it rarely comes up in daily conversation. Recently in the news there has been a lot of talk about the topic which in turn influenced the summer project. Working closely with the STEM instructors, the idea was for the students to create 3 different shoes that communicate the different areas of concern regarding global warming: The cause, the effect, and the solution. Each shoe would have to be created using elements from the previous day's discussion to help reinforce the learning. After the shoes were created the students also had to create a matching shirt and jacket and include a note card that explained the inspiration and imagery within the shoe.
